The U.S. President's Malaria Initiative (PMI) and Mali joined forces in 2007 to combat malaria.

The country's malaria strategy is laser-focused on surveillance and increasing malaria intervention access to all at risk.

Alongside India, Mali was one of only two high burden countries to reduce malaria cases and deaths from 2018 to 2019.

PIONEERING SCALABLE SOLUTIONS

Starting in 2015, PMI piloted seasonal malaria chemoprevention (SMC) campaigns, which delivered a monthly preventive treatment to children under 5 to protect them from contracting malaria during the peak transmission season.

Evidence shows SMC dramatically reduces malaria cases and deaths in this age group, which accounts for two-thirds of all malaria deaths worldwide. Following success with these pilot campaigns in Mali as well as Senegal, PMI added SMC as a core intervention. In 2018, PMI secured SMC medicine to protect more than five million children across seven countries with high rates of seasonal malaria transmission.
