



# 15X SENEGAL

The President's Malaria Initiative and Senegal teamed up to reduce malaria's burden on Senegal's citizens and health system starting in 2007. Since then, Senegal's malaria cases dropped by 53% and malaria deaths declined by 26%. These gains set Senegal on the path to eliminate this disease. Outstanding leadership and partner engagement, high intervention coverage levels and a thriving data culture all are contributing to Senegal's success combatting malaria.

### NETS WITHOUT BORDERS

In 2019, the Senegalese and Gambian governments, in partnership with PMI and the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria, joined forces to orchestrate the "Senegambia Net Campaign, the first coordinated mass net-distribution campaign across international borders. The countries' coordinated planning, implementation and data-sharing was a breakthrough toward achieving comprehensive coverage of the most effective malaria interventions within and across countries. And offered other countries a model for similar cross-border malaria control initiatives.
